5+ A Day supports FIS with comprehensive curriculum-linked education resources available free of charge.




Fruit & Vegetables in Schools

Fruit & Vegetables in Schools is funded by Te Whatu Ora and managed by United Fresh.

It provides daily fresh fruit and vegetables to children in schools/kura in low socio-economic areas across Aotearoa. The initiative was piloted in 25 schools in 2004 and has grown to reach;





Supply & Distribution

A wide range of high-quality fruit and vegetables are supplied to schools with an emphasis on New Zealand-grown seasonal produce.

Most schools receive two deliveries per week on Mondays and Wednesdays with fruit and vegetables for all students and staff at each school.

Research – Kiwi Parents

In 2023 we commissioned Quigley and Watts to carry out a research project with Fruit and Vegetables in Schools (FIS) principals;

External Evaluation of Fruit & Vegetables in Schools

92% of principals said FIS supported their school/kura greatly to promote a healthy food environment

93% of principals said FIS is a great support for feeding hungry tamariki with healthy food

95% rated the quality of the fresh fruit and vegetables as good or great

97% of principals rated the management of FIS as good or great

Our in-house Sustainability Survey with schools showed;

80% of schools/kura have systems in place to deal with cores and peels including composting, farm animals and worm farms

98% of schools advised they had no wasted fresh fruit and vegetables

63% of schools have planted vegetable gardens
